Steps to Removing Pavement

- Soil Test:** If the soil is found to be contaminated it is best to leave it paved, if the soil is not contaminated the pavement can be removed.
- Cutting:** use a diamond blade saw to cut the pavement in a grid pattern.
- Pry up the pieces:** use crow bars and lots of volunteer labor to pry up the pieces, the asphalt can be recycled into other construction projects.
- Aerate:** the soil is compacted and needs to be aerated to allow oxygen and nutrients to penetrate the soil.
- Planting:** now the soil is ready to be re-planted.
